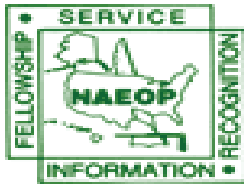


It isn't to late to purchase a brick for the Jackie Evans Memorial Garden which is located at the national headquarters.
